M.S. in Medicine

Since 2018, the Higher Education Ordinance mandates a new degree requirement that encompasses comprehensive educational objectives relating to the understanding of men's violence against women and intimate partner violence. These objectives have been further specified and tailored to various educational programs at Swedish universities, highlighting specific competencies, skills, judgments, approaches, and formulated content. Below are objectives in the program of Medicine from one of the universities.

Objectives

Knowledge and understanding

- Describe and discuss men's violence against women from a structural perspective.
- Describe and discuss the processes associated with violence in close relationships.
- Account for the prevalence of men's violence against women and violence in close relationships.
- Describe how exposure to violence can affect health.
- Account for and apply healthcare's responsibility towards women and children who have experienced violence.
- Ask questions about exposure to violence as part of the medical history.
- Regarding men's violence against women and violence in close relationships, explain the healthcare system's responsibility, and regarding sexual abuse, describe the prevalence and consequences, while expressing understanding for the patient's entire life situation.
