Since 2018, the Higher Education Ordinance mandates a new degree requirement that encompasses comprehensive educational objectives relating to the understanding of men's violence against women and intimate partner violence. These objectives have been further specified and tailored to various educational programs at Swedish universities, highlighting specific competencies, skills, judgments, approaches, and formulated content.

This is not mandatory at the (second level) Midwifery program but below are objectives from the program from different universities.

## **Objectives**

Knowledge and understanding

- Define and describe sexual abuse and motivate the importance of appropriate response.
- Account for sexual abuse and motivate the importance of appropriate response.
- Identify and assess the consequences of violence and sexual abuse and explain the handling and supportive interventions.

## Competence and skills

- Problematize and reflect upon women's exposure to violence, and how this may affect women's health
- Problematize and reflect upon women's situation in terms of gender, diversity, and equal opportunity, and how these factors may affect women's health.
